

Conditions of Entry –Youth and Community Centre

By entering the Youth and Community Centre you agree to comply with Public Health Order directions and Council's Conditions of Entry while on the premises. These conditions have been put in place to protect the health and welfare of members of the public during the Covid-19 pandemic, and align with the Youth and Community Centre Safety Plan.

Physical Distancing

- 1 Ensure the maximum safe capacity of 55 people is not exceeded (based on 1 person per 4m²).
- 2 Ensure activities are as non-contact as possible.
- 3 Ensure a distance of 1.5m is maintained between individuals.
- 4 Ensure you arrive and leave as close as possible to when you need to be there and ensure social congregation does not occur during pick up and drop off periods.

Handwashing and Hygiene

- 1 Practice good hygiene by following NSW Health posters displayed within the Facility, including hand washing with soap and water or sanitizer, and covering coughs and sneezes with a tissue or by coughing into your elbow.

Cleaning

- 1 High-touch areas of the Youth and Community Centre are cleaned by the hirer during and after each hire. Council cleans the facility each evening.

General

- 1 Supply contact details for contact tracing purposes, noting this record will be supplied to Council, on request by the Chief Medical Officer. The record must include name of attendee, contact phone number or email and date of attendance.
- 2 You must not access the Youth and Community Centre if:
 - a) You have a sore throat, cough and/or flu-like symptoms; or
 - b) You been in contact with someone diagnosed as having Covid-19, and in which case you must not attend the Facility for 14 days.
- 3 Contact Forbes Shire Council immediately if any of your party is diagnosed with Covid-19 and has attended the Youth and Community Centre within the last 14 days of being diagnosed.
- 4 Council reserves the right to alter conditions of entry or revoke access to its facilities in the event of amendments to Public Health Orders, or a local outbreak of Covid-19 in the Forbes community.
